NOTICE TO ALL MEMBERS ,VENETIAN VILLAGE, and SHIRLEY SHORES as a whole:
Yesterday (Friday June 23rd) i was informed by RON HART (LCWA) that St Johns had been wanting last week to pump off the NORTH SHORE of Lake Apopka in to Lake Apopka to protect the roadways on their wildlife drive.

The LCWA talked them out of it and ask them to NOT although the final decision is St Johns. The Lake Apopka water level is above regulation and although the rate of flow from the nurf is not nearly as high as could be, the Lake is dropping . Nevertheless the Final decision was put off until Monday morning (this monday,June 25th)

The pumping of the north shore would add to the depth of lake apopka to the point where the nurf plant would have to run at full capacity sending Millions more tons of polluted water and muck downstream as we experienced in December when the North Shore was pumped off so as to open the Apopka Wildlife drive for Christmas. It has already been established the Nurf cannot handle this large of capacity.

The ALUM supply is very low(problems again on delivery) and the holding ponds for the Nurf are full again. Even though a third dredge was recommended by the LCWA board at last months meeting , the cost found out was \$179,000 which they did not spend.

This means that ALL water, muck and pollutants would not be treated again as after the hurricane and sent downstream to further fill our canals and pollute the AB canal and the HARRIS CHAIN. It is more than possible that the holding ponds that are full would also flood and be sent downstream as well. These ponds hold what has already been cleaned out of the Apopka water before coming downstream these prior weeks. SOOOO-the worst of the worst!

The North shore is NOW MOSTLY THE APOPKA WILDLIFE DRIVE which was developed by St John with the millions of dollars from state and other identities.. NO REGARD TO FIXING THE MUCK FLOW PROBLEM DOWNSTREAM that POLLUTES THE RESIDENTIAL CANALS AND THE ENTIRE CHAIN OF LAKES FROM LAKE APOPKA BEFORE HAND. MONEY WENT OTHER PLACES.

With Hurricane Irma in Sept 2017 we received millions of gallons of muck and polluted water from not only Lake Apopka but from the flooded Lake Jem farms (due to 2 breaches in their barriers). The Tammi drive canal is only navigable at the moment due to higher water. That will be gone with this deluge of muck and pollutants ,in my opinion ,or at the very least render us not navigable sooner than not..The Lois drive canal did not receive the damage in nutrients filling in as Tammi dr. The wind will be a factor again on this next release should it happen.The entrance to Lake Beauclair is filling in again as before.

I may say this to my neighbors ,fellow fisherman, Mayors of neighboring towns. that through all the meetings, not one word of dredging or ongoing maintenance has been discussed. All meetings have been information gathering and communicating the problems. These steps are
